

#### **Ages Served FY2023**




#### Service

We served 824 youth in FY2023. The majority of those were ages 5 to 9 years old. Over 55% of youth served are eligible for free and reduced lunch that, combined with low fees and scholarships mean that anyone can attend Clubs but ALL income levels come to us knowing our quality staff and programs.

#### **Keeping Quality High**

Programs quality and staff training are critical for a good Club experience. Programs focus on positive youth development using intentional activities designed to create fun learning. Staff learn these skills and relationship building to ensure a safe emotional and physical environment. Clubs kept fees low-charging \$25 for before and after school programming, including daily snacks. Summer camp was kept at \$50, including hot meals and field trips.

#### **Assisting the Workforce:**

"Where are your capes? You guys are superheros!" That is what one parent said when Boys & Girls Club expanded its Elkton Club to include families affected by the closure of Rockingham County Parks & Rec after school program, Plains and Elkton Clubs took in Parks & Rec families and youth and a temporary Club was expedited and opened at Lacey Springs Elementary school within weeks of those closures.

# **FY2023 Service Impact**

#### **Community Impact**

WOW! Boys & Girls Clubs impact on the community measures up to meet the need. We served 13% more youth and families than last year in 8 Clubs for over 219 days. Cost is not a barrier to our services, as we provided many with scholarships on top of our low charges. This all happens with a group of dedicated staff: the people who prepare our young people to be our future citizens.





JMU STEM Corps is one group that works closely with our Clubs to bring detailed STEM program to our City Clubs. We hope to expand this partnership to all Clubs in the future.
